We are thankful to all the parents that were able to make it and to our staff that are always willing to be here for students and parents. We are fully staffed and growing. We have 115 students to date, 8 regular education teachers and 2-.5 Special Education teachers. Please let us know if you have any questions or concerns, we need to address. Fridays are all early release days. If your child is not in after school, they need to be picked up by 12:30. If they are in after school, pick up is at 3:30. We appreciate our after-school staff that work hard every day after school to give your child a fun and instructional experience. They go above and beyond each day and we are blessed to have them as part of our school community.

We are also fortunate to have our Art and PE teachers, Ms. Kayla and Ms. Anita. They conduct 30 minute classes Tuesday - Thursday for each teacher which allows the teachers to have a 60 minute prep period on those days. We are working to provide nutrition/gardening classes on Mondays starting in September.

In the third-grade class for **science** we plan to hatch some chicken eggs. In **math** we will be working on word problems, place value, one, two, and three digit multiplication equations. Learning the multiples for each digit up to 12 and practicing adding and subtract all digit combinations within three seconds will be ongoing throughout the semester. In **language arts** we will be working on narrative writing, story elements, guided reading, proper punctuation, verbs, nouns, adjectives, and proper nouns.(one per week) Instruction will be given as a whole group and in small group centers. **Xchinathcli** we will be learning the Maya Calendar, practicing our morning greetings, practicing the Nawathl numbers, and listening to cultural stories.
