What We Are Learning.

Language Arts:

- Resource (Heggerty) to practice phonics and reading skills. We will continue to work on sentence structures, using capital letters and end marks. We will be working on paragraphs using transition words: First, next, last. Students are required to read 15 minutes after completing homework. They will use the Reading Log to complete and return on Monday.

Math:

Student will add and subtract two-digit numbers. Students will continue to use Two-step word problems with all operations Computations and Algebraic Thinking – Multi-digit Addition and Subtraction Word Problems. Students will use visual representations to practice representing numbers in standard form and expanded form. Student will work using the Place Value to identify the ones, tens, hundreds in a number.



3rd Grade - Jessica Castro-Buelna

Wow we are coming into the middle of the year. The students have been working hard to understand new concepts and have adapted to changes made in the classroom. Please read **IMPORTANT Homework information.** Please see below a few pictures of the students' learning process through interconnection of math and engineering. The students task was to construct any type of building with the different shapes in a matter of time. Some teams had difficulty while others were successful. The other task they were to complete was counting the shapes' sides and making sure they group the correct amount by adding or grouping to complete some type of multiplication process. Below you will find what we will be working on for the month of December.













- Language arts/social studies, we will dive into working on poems. The student will be
 working on how to create poems and also reciting them. Students have chosen their
 poem to recite, and I ask you help them at home to recite them. Below you will find a link

- Xinachtli Maestro Carlos has visited our classroom to expand our knowledge about Nahuatl and Xinachtli. He will continue to work with us on the creation of our Tonalmachiotl area of the classroom. In the last weeks, the students have learned about the phases of the moon and how it connects to the Tonalmachiotl. We will be learning how to find the moons using our hands. - Math, we will continue to work on some number talks. With the use of the
 Nepohualtzintzin the students have managed to learn how to use them to add and
 subtract and are slowly getting the hang of it. We have been very successful working on
 simple multiplication. We are still working hard on story problems and making sure we
 know the information we need and get rid of the information we don't need.
 - Students can practice their math skills working in SplashLearn. They will receive their login within this next week. Here are the instructions:

- **Science** students will continue to hypothesize and ask questions. We have been working on anchor phenomenon lessons to deepen what the students are learning within the lesson. We will be working on life cycles linking it to our own growth as well.
- Physical Education students will be moving around and exercising their bodies. We will
 talk about the importance of healthy lifestyles and how to make sure we are keeping
 healthy.
